



#### 4. REPORTS


1st quarter 7th grade writing - 11.2% mastered the standard and 88.8% did not master the standard.




3rd quarter 7th grade writing - 43.2% mastered the standard and 56.8% did not master the standard.



1st quarter 8th grade writing - 39.3% mastered the standard and 60.7 % did not master the standard.



3rd quarter 8th grade writing - 22.9% mastered the standard and 77.1% did not master the standard.



1st semester 7th grade reading - 35.2% mastered the standard and 64.8% did not master the standard.



2nd semester 7th grade reading - 7.7% mastered the standard and 92.3% did not master the standard.



1st semester 8th grade reading - 43.1% mastered the standard and 56.9% did not master the standard.



2nd semester 8th grade reading - 33.1% mastered the standard and 66.9% did not master the standard.



To respond to these results Stephanie Devis (who is the MTSS liaison) had a full day to conduct a cycle of inquiry. The teachers who attended the pull out day realized that the curriculum is just a tool and the focus needs to be on the standards. The Language Arts department is now coming up with a common assessment that is focussed on the standards given once a month. Department has requested whiteboards to help check for understanding. The department has also requested one day a month to pull out of the classroom to analyze their assessments and plan instruction depending on the results of the assessment.

# 5. COMMENTS/QUESTIONS

The question was asked if the same standards were assessed with each assessment - it was not the same standard assessed.

Whiteboards will be ordered for core classes with lines on one side and blank on the other, math will have graph lines on theirs.

Results are disappointing however teachers are aware that curriculum, teaching strategies, and planning is needed to help students master standards. Now that it is known what standards will be assessed, the deficits of the curriculum and the need for the cycle of inquiry to help see how students are mastering the standards will be used moving forward throughout the year.
